4TH OF JULY PARADE MONUMENT

Here's the scoop from Don Stoner on the 4th of July parade in Monument.

All parade entrants must enter through the South Baptist Road entry point. Walking entrants must park at the South Entry Point. 2way bus transport will be provided. Old Denver Highway is CLOSED except for floats and motorized entries.

0700-0830 Parade lineup; no parking on Old Denver Highway

0830-0930 Judging (I have not asked to be judged)

0930 Children's Parade start

1000 Parade start

That said, we will line up and start at the corner of Jefferson and Lincoln at 0930 and be first in the parade. I will be parking as close to the end of the parade route as possible and plan to enjoy the pancake breakfast being served at St. Peter's Catholic Church on the same corner, which starts about 0800. After we are finished, I hope to get out my chairs and watch the rest of the parade while trying to re-hydrate myself.

Wear your mountain attire. Bring PERCUSSION ONLY rifles and a minimum of 50 blank rounds. Leave all your round balls at home, please. Instructions for safe procedures to protect the kids pulling the trigger, will be demonstrated at line up.

Bring water for before and after the parade. This is very important as it will be hot and you will dehydrate.

The theme this year is "Planes, Trains, and Automobiles - - Moving America Forward". I wrote that the Mountain Men opened this land for settlers, homesteaders, and such to use plans, trains, and automobiles.

H. E. LEMAN LANCASTER, P.A. WARRANTED

H. E. Leman Lancaster PA Warranted stamped on a gun in the early 1800's meant dependability. It's still true today.

Leman's rifles gained him a permanent place in history when 93 out of the 160 guns taken from the hostiles after the Custer fight were tamped H.E. Leman Lancaster Pa. Warranted.

Although Leman's full stock trade gun made him famous on the frontier, where red and white man alike, lived by their skill and daring, his half-stock sporting rifle was just as much sought after in the east where men had time to hunt and shoot for pleasure.

Leman's trade rifle as a **general rule** were heavy calibered, and short barreled, about 30 inches with a 50 to 54 caliber and 1-1/16 across the flats, straight maple (artificially striped), and were plain brass mounted. But, Leman's half-stock sporting rifle was a different matter. The sporting rifle came in a variety of calibers and barrel lengths. Maple and walnut were used in various grades of the stock. German silver, brass and iron hardware were also used. It was not uncommon to see these guns checkered at the wrist, with steel butt plates, and brass trigger guards with German silver escutcheons.
