I neglected to warn our crew that the shoot is conducted per the NMLRA rules; i.e, one-handed.

The NMLRA has added a separate aggregate for those 65 years old or older, which permits using both hands (remember when 65 was old?). I plan on admitting my age and entering this match at Friendship this year. Shooting with one hand threw Al off for his first three shots; but in a 10 shot match, 3 shots is forever!

The match was three aggregates, 25 and 50 yards for percussion, revolver, and flint for a total grand aggregate of 600 points. The winners were:




NO regular monthly meeting in July.
